When Brittany received the news that she had been accepted into the program, she cried tears of joy. "I wondered what made me stand out," she admitted. "I recall feeling very grateful that I had qualified for this new opportunity." Brittany has thoroughly enjoyed the classes and learning what homeownership is all about. She will be the first in her family to own a home, and she does not take this responsibility lightly.

For the last several years, Brittany has been living in an apartment. "The noise is loud, and sometimes can be a distraction", she said.
